GCSE Results 2019

GCSE results continue above average in 2019:

- 73.2% of pupils achieved 5 or more GCSEs at Grade 4+
- 71.4% of pupils achieved 5 or more GCSEs at Grade 4+including English and Mathematics
- 41.1% of entries were Grade 6+
- 82.0% of entries were Grade 4+

GCSE Results 2015

- 93.5% of pupils achieved 5 or more GCSEs at A* to C
- 80.4% of pupils achieved 5 or more GCSEs at A* to C including English and Mathematics
- 69.3% of entries were A*-B
- 90.9% of entries A*-C

Top Performing GCSE subjects 2015

All of our Year 13 students who chose this route secured a place on undergraduate courses at universities of choice for September 2019, to read a range of degrees, including:

Accountancy, Business, Business and Fashion, Chemistry, Early years teaching Law, Mathematics, Mathematics and Spanish, Medical Sciences, Pharmacy, Physiotherapy

In addition, one student has gained a place at Sandhurst and another a sports scholarship at Oregon University in the USA.
